WHYY-FM's *Newsworks Tonight* to Broadcast Live from Beach Haven

On-location broadcast focuses on hurricane Sandy recovery

PHILADELPHIA, June 12, 2013 — On Wednesday, July 3, WHYY-FM's *Newsworks Tonight* will broadcast live at 6:00 p.m. from the Surflight Theatre, located at 201 Engleside Avenue in Beach Haven, NJ. *NewsWorks Tonight* is a half-hour news program that features regional news reports drawing on information gathered by the staff of WHYY.

Taking place the Wednesday before the Fourth of July holiday, *NewsWorks Tonight* host Dave Heller will anchor the program, which is the second in a series of three remote broadcasts from the Jersey Shore this summer. The sequence of shows focuses on the Jersey Shore's rebuilding efforts in the aftermath of hurricane Sandy. Listeners will hear from WHYY reporter Tracey Samuelson, as well as other reporters who cover New Jersey. The general public is welcome to observe the program live at the Surflight Theatre. After the broadcast, Heller, Samuelson and the *NewsWorks Tonight* team will be available for a meet and greet.

"Since the expansion of our airwaves into New Jersey, we've increased our reporting capabilities in the Garden State and brought more discussion of New Jersey topics to our programs," said Bill Marrazzo, WHYY president and CEO. "As a reflection of our commitment to expanding our presence in this community, we are pleased to maintain an ongoing presence at the shore this summer."

WHYY acquired operation of five former New Jersey Network radio stations in July 2011. Now WHYY-FM's broadcast coverage extends from Princeton to Cape May and from Camden to the shore. *Newsworks Tonight* can be heard on the airwaves in New Jersey on WNJZ-FM, 90.3, Cape May Court House, WNJM-FM, 89.9, Manahawkin, WNJN-FM, 89.7, Atlantic City, WNJB-FM, 89.3, Bridgeton, and WNJS-FM, 88.1, Berlin.
