WHYY-FM's *Newsworks Tonight* to Broadcast Live from Lewes, DE

PHILADELPHIA, June 2, 2014 — On Friday, June 27, WHYY-FM's *Newsworks Tonight* will broadcast live at 6:00 p.m. from Lewes Canalfront Park, located at 211 Front Street in Lewes, DE. *NewsWorks Tonight* is a half-hour news program that features regional news reports drawing on information gathered by the staff of WHYY.

NewsWorks Tonight host Dave Heller will anchor the program. The show will focus on the 50th anniversary of the Cape May-Lewes Ferry and WHYY's recent production of ***Billion Mile Journey: The Cape May-Lewes Ferry***, a one-hour documentary about the history of the ferry and the lives it has touched over the last five decades.

Listeners will hear from John Mussoni, managing editor of WHYY's Delaware news operation and veteran reporter Tom MacDonald, as well as other reporters who cover Delaware and New Jersey. The general public is welcome to observe the program live at Lewes Canalfront Park. After the broadcast, Heller, Mussoni, MacDonald and the *NewsWorks Tonight* team will be available to answer questions.

"This remote broadcast honors the golden anniversary of both organizations."
