**BEAU BIDEN DISCUSSES POLITICAL FUTURE,
SERVING IN IRAQ ON WHYY-TV'S *FIRST* ON NOV. 6**

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 5, 2009 — *First*, WHYY-TV's 30-minute news and information magazine program dedicated to serving Delaware, features an interview with Beau Biden in its Nov. 6 episode.

During the program's "First Person" segment, Delaware's attorney general discusses whether he's considering running for the vacant U.S. Senate seat once occupied by his father, Vice President Joe Biden.

"I'm absolutely considering, I'm very seriously considering [running]," he told *First* co-host Bill Cook. "I don't have a timeline I can give you. I made it clear then when I was in the Attorney General's office that I don't want to be appointed to anything. Whatever office I seek in the future, I'll work hard to earn that and earn the right to hold that office."

A member of the Delaware Army National Guard and JAG Corps, Biden also discussed his assignment to enforce the uniform code of military justice while stationed at Victory Base in Iraq. Cook asked Biden whether he took special precautions because of his stature.

"I never felt like I was in imminent danger," he said. "I hope I never put anyone else in harm's way. At the end of the day, you are in a war zone and you are aware of taking security precautions at every moment."
